<p>History (Years 5 and 6)</p> <p>History we will be exploring 'Could the second World War have been avoided'. We will learn about the different causes of the First World War and consider why so many lives were lost on the Western Front. We will explore the reasons Hitler rose to power and the causes of the Second World War.</p>	<p>RE (Year 5 and 6)</p> <p>This half term our R.E unit is The Bible</p> <p>The unit aims are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •deepen children’s understanding of the importance and impact of the contents of the Bible in the lives of Christians. •to develop further children’s understanding of the significance of holy books in the lives of the people of all world faiths. 		<p>PE (Years 4, 5 and 6)</p> <p>Our PE sessions will be on a Wednesday morning. This half term we will be focussing on our fielding and striking skills, Year 4 and 5 will be going swimming on a Thursday morning.</p>	
	<p>Maths (Years 4, 5 and 6)</p> <p>In Maths, year 4 and 5 will be focussing on finding the area and perimeter of shapes and applying this to word problems. They will also be looking at how to measure and draw angle, calculate angles around a point, on a straight line and in a triangle.</p> <p>Year 6 will be focussing on a project using their statistics skills to plan holiday tours.</p>		<p>PSHE (Year 5 and 6)</p> <p>Our topic this term is 'The Working World'. We will be looking at ways we can help society, our community and at home. We will learn about Enterprise and consider jobs for the future.</p>	
	<p>Science (Year 5 and 6)</p> <p>Our Science topic this half term is: Types of Change. We will be demonstrating that dissolving, mixing and changes of state are reversible changes through different experiments. We will learn that some changes result in the formation of new materials, and that this kind of change is not usually reversible, including changes associated with burning and the action of acid on bicarbonate of soda.</p>		<p>Art (Year 5 and 6)</p> <p>In Art we will explore the work of architects and individual builder/designers, and use sketchbooks and drawing to collect, process and reflect upon ideas.</p> <p>We will then go on to build an architectural model of their aspirational home or tiny house, before sharing as a class to see the village that has been made.</p>	
<p>Computing (Years 5 and 6)</p> <p>In Computing we will be planning a story adventure, creating a story-based adventure. We will learn to read and understand given code for a text adventure game and how to debug and improve a text adventure game.</p> <p>In online safety lessons we will be focussing on privacy and security looking at how to create strong passwords and how to increase privacy on apps.</p>			<p>Music (Year 5 and 6)</p> <p>In Music we will be focusing on 'Music and Me' Children will explore the concept of ‘identity’ through Music.</p>
