

Curriculum Overview

Year 2 and 3 – Spring Term 2 2023-2024

English

The Iron Man - Novel as a theme

Reading

Listen to and discuss a range of fiction.

Regularly listen to whole novels read aloud by the teacher.

Use intonation, tone and volume when reading aloud.

Explain the meaning of unfamiliar words by using the context.

Use knowledge of root words to understand meanings of words.

Identify, discuss and collect favourite words and phrases which capture the reader's interest and imagination.

Use dictionaries to check meanings of words they have read.

Raise questions during the reading process to deepen understanding e.g. I wonder why the character ...

Draw inferences around characters thoughts, feelings and actions, and justify with evidence from the text.

Use point and evidence to structure and justify responses.

Sequence and discuss the main events in stories.

Make and respond to contributions in a variety of group situations e.g. whole class, pairs, guided groups, book circles

Writing

Select, generate and effectively use adverbs e.g. silently, soon, next Explore, identify and create sentences using a range of conjunctions e.g. since, until, before, as.

Use the comma to separate clauses in complex sentences where the subordinate clause appears first.

Use inverted commas to punctuate direct speech (speech marks) Read and analyse narrative in order to plan and write own version.

Identify and discuss the language and structures of narrative for writing. Create and develop settings for narratives.

Create and develop characters for narrative.

Create and develop plots based on a model.

Generate and select from vocabulary banks e.g. noun phrases, powerful verbs, appropriate to text type.

Group related material into paragraphs.

Recount Diaries

Reading

Listen to and discuss a range of diaries.

Read a range of recounts: diaries.

Discuss their understanding of the text.

Make predictions based on details stated.

Use point and evidence to structure and justify responses.

Identify discuss and collect favourite words and phrases which capture the reader's interest and imagination.

Draw inferences around characters thoughts, feelings and actions, and justify with evidence from the text.

Analyse and evaluate texts looking at language, structure and presentation e.g. diaries.

Make and respond to contributions in a variety of group situations e.g. whole class, pairs, guided groups, book circles

Writing

Use the determiner 'a' or 'an' according to whether the next word begins with a consonant or vowel e.g. a rock, an open box.

Read and analyse diaries in order to plan and write own versions. Identify and discuss the purpose, audience, structure, vocabulary and grammar of diaries for writing

Homework

This will include spellings we have worked on in class to consolidate before the spelling weekly test. It may also include other projects and subjects.
